Competition Admin

- ► Annual Leave
- Booked to coincide with your competition of choice
- Competition Licence
- ➤ You must be in possession of an FAI Licence before entering any BGA rated competition the licence can be obtained in a number of ways as below.
- If this is an initial application, <u>you can apply for one online</u>.
- If you have previously held an FAI Licence but not renewed it recently then please contact BGA office who will regenerate your existing licence number and make it available for renewal within E-Services
- If you held a valid licence last year, then you can renew within <u>E-services</u> by logging in to your account and selecting the "Subscription" tab
- If you enter a National Championship, your FAI licence can be renewed at the same time.



Competition Licence

Extract from the BGA Competition Handbook

- 2 PILOT ENTRY- GENERAL
- 2.1 PILOT LICENCING, ELIGIBILITY & CONDUCT
- 2.1.1 FAI Competition Licence

All pilots, including hors-concours entries, except two-seater P2s, must hold a valid FAY Competition Licence. Note: these can be obtained through the BGA website at www.gliding.co.uk. Applicants must hold a Silver badge.



Glider

- 1. Fly your own Glider (syndicates will need agreement from your partners)
 - a. Perhaps individuals 'comp rating' decides who gets first dibs etc
- 2. Borrow / Hire a Glider from an individual or club.
 - a. make sure a written agreement is drafted and signed.
 - b. Exercise due diligence at take over / hand over.
- 1. Ensure the Annual and ARC are going to be in date during the comp
- 2. Ensure your insurance is valid for the duration of the comp





Crew

- 1. Arrange a Crew commensurate with the glider type flown.
- 2. Your crew is there to look after you. Especially if you land out.
- 3. If you don't have any friends promise beer.
- 4.and a crew meal at some point in the proceedings!

Landed out 1944 – Retrieved 2023





- 1. Fly your glider as much as possible prior to the competition
- 2. Fly Condor 2 tasks from the Competition Site to become airfield and airspace familiar
- 3. Use your instruments and charts often to ensure competency
- 4. When was the last time you aerotowed?





SCOTTISH COmpetition Handbook

Read the Competition Handbook – available to download from the BGA Website - are you familiar enough with the rules to defend your self if there is a protest against your flying?





1:500000 Chart

- 1. Buy a 1:500000 chart that covers the competition site and task area
- 2. Study the chart well before you get to the competition
- 3. Fly tasks from the competition site on Condor 2 and link to a device with software such as XCSoar to familiarise yourself with airspace.





Fly your Glider

- 1. There is no substitute for practice
- 2. Get to know your instruments intimately.
- 3. How long does it take you to program a task?
- 4. Do you know how to change McCready settings in flight....whilst keeping a good lookout?





Confidence

- 1. You'll be flying in close proximity to a large number of gliders especially before the start line opens
 - 1. Ensure you get plenty of practice prior to the competition
 - 2. How's your thermal technique?
 - 3. How's your Navigation skills?
 - 4. Field Landing currency?



SCOTTISH The week before the comp

- 1. De-rig the glider ready to travel after flying it of course!
- 2. Ensure all necessary equipment is packed in the trailer / car
 - i. A/C Batteries and chargers
 - ii. Parachutes
 - iii. A/C Documentation
 - iv. Pilot Documentation
 - v. Charts inc cleaning kit, marking kit, measuring kit etc
 - vi. Glider Cleaning Kit
 - Vii. Glider tie down kit
 - viii. Water ballast barrels / containers / funnels / pipes / etc
 - ix. One man tow-out kit
 - x. Tow rope
 - xi. Personal comfort kit
 - xii. Flying clothing / soaring hat / sunglasses / sunscreen
 - resexiii.Water bottles / in flight snacks (non perishable)



Arrival / Booking In

- 1. Arrival at the Competition Site
 - a. Competition registration all personal and A/C docs
 - b. Set up camp site / sort trailer parking / rig and park glider
 - c. Fly the practice day check everything is working / present / familiarity with site etc.
 - d. Charge Batteries
 - e. Read local rules
 - f. Check instruments etc ensure correct turning point info for start and first lines / sectors



Ready to Compete

1. Day 1 and beyond – well rested – fit to fly?

Crew Jobs

Glider prep – includes DI, Canopy cleaning, Wing Tape, Water Ballast, batteries
Tow out and position glider on grid
Launch Glider when it's time to do so
Ready the trailer – just in case
When glider returns – retrieve from airfield
Clean Glider and secure for the night
Charge Batteries

Pilot Jobs

Attend Briefing / mark task on chart/ program instrumentation (involve the P2 cress)

Personal prep / comfort / positive mental attitude

Plan your flight/ tactics / check list complete

Fly the task

Book In to control with logger evidence
