## Operations at the Scottish Gliding Centre for Flying under Covid-19 Restrictions

This Assessment covers the risk of contracting Covid-19 when gliding is resumed at the Scottish Gliding Centre. The assessment covers staff, club members and visiting pilots and limited air experience flights

	Flights	In all areas of the Scottish Gliding Centre, indoors and outside, always keep a distance of at least 2m from each other.  Conference calls and webinars to be used for meetings and briefings instead of face to face meetings.  Only one person at a time in a tow vehicle. Open mules can accommodate 2 people as long as the passenger sits at the back on the opposite side to the driver.  Only one person at a time in the launch caravan.  Maximum of 2 people in simulator room, either one or both using the simulator. Masks to be worn.  Mask must be worn indoors and while level 2 or above restrictions apply also outdoors when near (2m distance) another person for more than 3 minutes.  Restrictions to bubble size according to SGA Guidance and depending on level restrictions for Perth and Kinross. Wearing of Gloves Gloves (ideally disposable) should be worn when cleaning aircraft or launch area, assisting at the launch or in the launch caravan.  Frequent handwashing before and after touching anything that could be contaminated is a good alternative. Flying 2 seater  Flying 2 up in a 2 seater when both instructor and student have agreed and have to their knowledge not been in contact with anyone infected with Covid-19 in the last 7 days.  Wearing of face coverings is advised unless this restricts visibility (risk of spectacle fogging). Both pilots (or student and instructor) must agree if flying without face coverings).
